Lost in art is a project aimed at people living in the community with dementia. Would you like the opportunity to join arts and craft sessions each week? We work with a variety of materials, producing our own artwork. No previous art experience necessary - this is a chance to engage with art, make friends, socialize and share experiences whilst trying out something new together. The sessions are led by professional artists who are also Dementia Friends.



The aim of the project is to explore the role of the visual arts in addressing issues which can affect people with dementia, including social isolation, confidence, communication and quality of life and wellbeing. The project was developed with the support of the Dementia Services Development Centre at Bangor University. Family members and carers are welcome at the sessions if they wish to attend.
